

Business Administration Minor

What is the Business Administration Minor?

The College of Business at Colorado State University offers a Business Administration Minor which covers many aspects in the field of business, including Accounting, Finance, Marketing, and Management. The Business Administration Minor consists of 24 credits and allows students to focus in business in addition to their primary program of study. It is intended to provide students with a foundation in business administration.

Who is Eligible for the Business Administration Minor?

The Business Administration Minor is designed specifically for non-business students. Therefore, it is available to undergraduate students from any college at CSU other than the College of Business.

Admission Requirements

There are no special admission requirements for the Business Administration Minor. To declare the minor, simply complete a *Business Administration Minor Survey* and submit it during a Business Minor Seminar.
